What did we decide to do?

- Give students IELTS reading
- Observe their strategies



Most common question types

- 1. YNNG/TFNG (30%)
- 2. Summary Completion (13%)
- 3. Heading Choice (11%)
- 4. Multiple Choice (10%)

Think Aloud Protocol

I read the questions first



Think Aloud Protocol

- 1. Explanation
- 2. Process (student/observer)
- 3. Action Research Cycles

1. Standardisation




What did we learn from Cycle 2?
