Why attend this training day?

This course is for staff who have designated responsibilities for safeguarding within a school/department. It is designed specifically for those working in ELT, whether the school is juniors only or a year-round adult school that takes a few 16 and 17 year olds. The half-day course helps designated staff understand their responsibilities and how to meet them. Participants need to have completed basic awareness safeguarding (formerly Level 1) training and feel comfortable with that before taking this advanced safeguarding training.

Safeguarding legislation and terminology differs slightly in each of the countries of the UK (England, Wales, Scotland and Northern Ireland). Delegates are welcome from any country, and will receive specific materials, but the focus of the training will be on legislation and terminology in England

What does it cover?

- the responsibilities of the role and further understanding of abuse
- managing an allegation, including supporting the victim
- paperwork required, especially in recording and reporting
- the pathway after reporting and working with local agencies
- legal background, required knowledge, better internet safety
- writing a safeguarding policy
- training your staff, involving the students and making a safer school
- recent updates
