Why attend this training day?

This session will look at ways of developing real and meaningful opportunities for teachers to develop in ELT even when working in an organisation for a short amount of time such as a summer season. Clear systems for providing, monitoring and measuring professional development are not only beneficial to the individual but also to the institution. We will look at implementing a thorough induction system, incorporating a number of developmental observation types, encouraging reflective habits and realistic short term goal setting. I will make reference to the British Council CPD framework and how this can be used as a developmental aid for summer managers and teachers alike.
