Why attend this training day?

Recent government updates (September 2016) have brought many small but important changes to improve safeguarding. The changes, which will particularly affect ISI inspected schools, will be covered as part of the training. There must be people in an ELT organisation able to fulfil the role of Designated Safeguarding Lead (DSL) one of whom should be a member of the senior management team. The DSL takes responsibility for the organisation delivering proper levels of safeguarding to its under 18 students. This half-day course helps the DSL understand their responsibilities, especially what will happen if they need to manage a child protection incident involving social care and/or the police. Participants need to have completed basic awareness training (formerly Level 1) and ideally also advanced safeguarding training for designated staff (formerly Level 2).

Safeguarding legislation and terminology differs slightly in each of the countries of the UK (England, Wales, Scotland and Northern Ireland). Delegates are welcome from any country, and will receive specific materials, but the focus of the training will be on legislation and terminology in England

What does it cover?

- overview of responsibilities
- managing the team of designated staff with safeguarding responsibilities
- 2015 and 2016 safeguarding developments
- training for all adults associated with your under 18s
- managing an allegation or child protection incident, including contact with relevant local authorities
- understanding the thresholds for referral and the needs of vulnerable children
- prevent requirements against terrorism (for all ages)
- maintaining a safer school ongoing development of better safeguarding practices
