Why attend this training day?

ELT organisations need to provide adequate levels of safeguarding. Designated staff support the designated safeguarding leads (separate training half-day for Designated Leads) in delivering safeguarding throughout the organisation. The training is tailored for ELT; whether your centre is for juniors only or is a year-round adult school that takes some 16 and 17 year olds, this half-day course helps designated staff understand their responsibilities and how to support the designated leads. Using practical exercises, trainees will better understand the types of safeguarding issues they may face and how to respond.

The new Accreditation UK handbook, covering inspections 2018-19 is due for release in Autumn 2017. Sessions occurring after its release will include discussion and explanation of any changes affecting safeguarding. Participants need to have completed basic awareness safeguarding (formerly Level 1) training, which can be done online, before taking this advanced safeguarding training.

Safeguarding legislation and terminology differs in each of the countries of the UK (England, Wales, Scotland and Northern Ireland). The focus of the training will be on legislation and terminology in England. Delegates from Scotland are advised that safeguarding provision there differs substantially and separate training is available from English UK.

- Further understanding of abuse
- Understanding the differences between concerns and allegations and how to manage them, including supporting the victim
- Recording framework and reporting pathway
- Legal background, required knowledge
- Reviewing a safeguarding policy
- Training your staff and making
- Application of safeguarding to your situation
