MISSION STATEMENT

RefuAid provides people who have fled their homes with tailored support to build independent and dignified lives in the UK.

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WHAT WE DO

At RefuAid, we provide people who have fled their homes with tailored support to build independent and dignified lives in the UK. All of our programmes have been shaped by the needs of our clients.

Language

In partnership with British Council accredited language schools, universities and exam providers across the UK, we support individuals to obtain the English language qualifications required for either higher education or professional re-accreditation. Tuition is entirely free for our students, and we support with travel costs, course materials and exam fees.

Re-accreditation

We provide tailored guidance on professional re-accreditation pathways and routes back into employment. In partnership with employers and professional bodies across various sectors, we offer bursaries, scholarships, membership waivers and professional networking opportunities.

Loan

We offer interest-free loan products for professional re-accreditation, housing and family reunification. Our lending processes are character-based, providing a lifeline to our clients, the majority of whom are excluded from mainstream financial products due to a lack of UK credit footprint.

Employability

In collaboration with businesses across the UK, we provide sector-specific pre-employment support to work-ready candidates. This includes employability days, mentoring, interview preparation and training, to improve confidence and prepare clients for the workplace.





Juhina, a doctor from Syria, first registered with RefuAid in September 2022. She studied General English with our fantastic partners at English Path, before studying OET at International House London, which she passed in June 2023.

Juhina then took out an interest-free Equal Access loan to cover the cost of her re-accreditation exams, courses and GMC registration fees.

In addition, she attended an employability day run by RefuAid and Guy's and St Thomas Trust, which gave her the confidence to successfully apply for a Senior Healthcare Assistant role at RefuAid's partner healthcare company HCA Healthcare, which she started at the beginning of 2024.









In order to continue with the next steps of her professional re-accreditation, including the PLAB exams and registration with the General Medical Council, Juhina took out an interest-free Equal Access loan. This covered the cost of her exams, courses and registration fees.

Whilst preparing for her PLAB exams, Juhina was keen to begin work within the NHS to gain experience in the sector. She attended an employability day run by RefuAid and Guy's and St Thomas Trust, where she was given insight into working within UK hospitals, how to apply for roles in the NHS and an opportunity to network with UK medical professionals. The event gave her the confidence to successfully apply for a Senior Healthcare Assistant role at RefuAid's partner healthcare company HCA Healthcare, which she started at the beginning of 2024.

they obtain the necessary qualifications to become UK work-ready.

Our interest-free loan, along with generous bursaries and scholarships from partners like Kaplan, CIPS and

CIPD, provides essential funding. Additionally, we facilitate course discounts, expert sector-specific advice, and qualification verification.

As a result, forcibly displaced individuals are registering with professional bodies and re-entering the workforce in roles that match their skills and experience, making valuable contributions to various sectors of the UK economy and society"



In 2023, we successfully migrated our existing loan portfolio to our new loan administrators, Moneyline. As an appointed representative of Moneyline, RefuAid remain the creditor, with administrative and regulatory oversight from the Moneyline team.

This allows us to leverage their experience and expertise, as well as their sophisticated lending platform, whilst allowing us to focus on maximising our impact.



EQUAL ACCESS LOAN

HOUSING 2023 - 2024

In 2023, we began seeing an increasing number of clients facing huge issues with housing; from short-notice Home Office evictions to competitive private rental markets, it was clear there was need for more support in accessing stable accommodation. One of the many barriers individuals were facing was simply access to affordable finance, in order to put down deposits and furnish properties appropriately.

We have therefore piloted a small scale trial of interest-free housing loans, providing the upfront capital for people to secure private tenancies and ensure their accommodation is adequately furnished.

Individuals have taken out an **Equal Access Housing Loan to date** ightarrow The average loan amount is 3.753.85

with the average monthly repayment of £97.75

of housing loan recipients are already repaying

We have not yet had any defaults or missed payments on this programme.

The housing loan enabled her to pay the deposit and purchase some furniture, including beds and a sofa. They're now living independently and Mercy can continue her work as a Healthcare Assistant within the NHS, without worrying about her living situation. *name changed

In 2023 we launched our tailored Healthcare Programme, aimed at establishing partnerships with NHS Trusts and healthcare providers across the country, to facilitate training and employment for RefuAid clients.

Wider Impact

Clinical Attachments:

Clinical attachments are unpaid work experience, usually for a set period of time, and are a useful way for international medical graduates to get a taste of the working lives of doctors and other health care professionals in the UK. This is hugely beneficial for those who requalifying.

Following our employability events with HCA Healthcare and NHS trust Guy's and St Thomas, we were delighted to have been offered clinical attachments for eligible RefuAid attendees.

This includes:

clinical attachments for doctors post OET at HCA Healthcare. All of these have now been filled.

clinical attachments at Guy's and St Thomas, with a commitment to creating an ongoing clinical placement for eligible RefuAid doctors at the Trust.

Pharmacists:

In 2023, we worked closely with the General Pharmaceutical Council and pharmacy training providers to expand the support available to refugee pharmacists.

A combination of very few course providers, unprecedented demand, and limited spaces meant that access to OSPAP (the re-accreditation course for overseas qualified pharmacists) was incredibly limited. This was exacerbating skills shortages across the sector, as well as time out of practice for many RefuAid clients.

We're thrilled to have worked with the amazing teams at both Aston University and the University of Sunderland to create 10 priority spaces each for refugee applicants applying to take OSPAP.

"Today I want to extend a huge thank you to RefuAid. I used to live in Kharkiv with my children and worked as a Consultant Rheumatologist before the war broke out. I also had the privilege of serving as a PhD Associate Professor at one of Ukraine's top universities for almost 15 years. But then, my world turned upside down.

I arrived here in the UK with nothing but despair. I began to survey my surroundings and explore my options, only to find that I couldn't practice medicine until I gained an equivalent UK qualification. The cost of re-accreditation was prohibitively expensive, and my English skills, while not terrible, were not sufficient for the exams.

Thankfully, I discovered RefuAid.

Their words of encouragement, "We are here to support you, and we will help you," meant the world to me. Their amazing team organised a preparation course for me and sponsored my OET exam. True to their word, they went above and beyond to assist me in my journey.

After obtaining my GMC registration, RefuAid helped to arrange a clinical attachment for me at one of the best private hospitals. **Tomorrow will be my first day in the NHS as a doctor**, and I am also in training for a role in a private hospital. My life is starting to become stable again, and all of this would have been impossible without RefuAid's support. Their constant guidance and encouragement were invaluable to my success."

Dr Inna graduated RefuAid's language programme in 2023, and has since been supported with a Clinical Attachment, employability support and GMC registration. She is now working at the Lewisham and Greenwich NHS Trust.











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
