Ivana from English UK's insight partner, BONARD, will guide you through the key findings of English UK's Student Statistics Report 2023: English language students in the UK in 2022.

Language: A Gateway programme

RefuAid's Language: A Gateway programme launched in 2016, working with accredited English language schools across the UK to provide free tuition for those who have had to flee their homes and have sought asylum in the UK. The programme has supported over 1,000 individuals from a displaced background – from Sudan to Ukraine, Afghanistan to Yemen - to gain the language qualification needed for either higher education or professional regualification.

In this session, RefuAid's Chief Operating Officer, Kate Higgins, will provide an update on the impact the programme has made, and both current and alumni students will share their stories.

The Future of English: Global perspectives

16:00 - 17:00

The British Council Future of English programme aims to identify key trends that will define the role of English as a global language in the coming decade, and the issues and opportunities for countries around the world in achieving their goals for the use of English in their contexts.

The starting point was the 2006 landmark publication English Next by David Graddol. We analysed Graddol's predictions 15 years after they were made and developed a new set of proposed trends. These were interrogated and revised during fourteen roundtables with policy makers and influencers across the globe. We are now developing an open-access research agenda as part of the next phase.

In this presentation, Mina, Mike and Steve will provide an overview of the programme, share findings from the roundtable data and discuss the impact they may have on teachers, institutions and governments, and suggest ideas for possible further research.

Mina Patel is a researcher with the Assessment Research Group at the British Council. Her background is in English language teaching and training and is currently a PhD student.

Mike Solly has worked in the English language teaching field for over 30 years and returned to the British Council at the end of 2015 with a global strategic role in English for Education systems.

Steve Copeland is Research and Insight Lead for the English Programmes team at the British Council. He was previously the British Council's Global Examiner Manager and Head of Examiner Standards for IELTS.
