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# INTRODUCTION

This student statistics report makes gloomy reading for everyone who cares about UK ELT, laying bare the devastation wreaked upon a global industry by a global pandemic. Though the Covid-19 picture in the UK is looking increasingly positive and more students may feel confident about booking, continuing restrictions on inbound travel may delay recovery.

But there is hope in the gloom. For instance, numbers of students enrolling on blended courses tell a story of resourcefulness, resilience and innovation: vital cornerstones of rebuilding.

Recovery is our priority, and these statistics have an important role. Our roadmap to recovery outlines our plan to rebuild confidence in world markets, working in partnership with the UK government and the British Council to amplify our message.

### **METHODOLOGY**

The core data in this report was collated from English UK annual student data submissions returned between 2010 and 2020.

Due care and attention were paid to align the annual data as much as possible. Notwithstanding, some of the figures in the report may not be directly comparable for the following reasons:

- The number of state and private sector centres in the English UK membership fluctuates year-on-year (y-o-y). Where appropriate, we have therefore introduced historical comparisons based on the same research sample (only centres reporting in both 2019 and 2020).
- Of the overall English UK membership, 13 were not in a position to supply their annual data and were, therefore, excluded from the 2020 reporting.
- Not all English UK private sector and state sector members are able to report more detailed information about their student population, and the sample per student age and country of origin breakdown varies. The actual number of reporting providers is always noted below the respective chart or table.
- Traditionally centres have been asked to report only on courses that take place face-to-face. To understand the impact of the pandemic, exceptionally for 2020, centres were also asked to report on student weeks that had originally been booked as face-to-face courses but due to Covid-19 had to be switched to a different mode of teaching delivery, either during the course itself or prior to course commencement.

**Note:** A full-time student week is defined as one student taking 10 or more teacher-taught hours in one week. In line with English UK's categorisation, part-time students are understood to be international English language students enrolled on courses offering fewer than 10 teacher-taught hours per week.

# **KEY FINDINGS**

#### **General Overview**

- In 2020, English UK members welcomed 83,446 full-time English language students for a combined 530,756 student weeks.
- Those numbers tumbled during the course of 2020 due to Covid-19, as in every major English Language Teaching (ELT) destination, with overall y-o-y declines of -71.1% in terms of student weeks and -83.6% in the number of students studying at English UK member centres. This figure does not reflect fluctuation in English UK membership.
- In a reverse of recent trends, across the whole membership, adults outnumbered junior students. Students under the age of 18 represented only 23% of the student population.
- There was an unprecedented decline in English UK's membership base, falling by 69 centres, from 415 in 2019.
- One in four weeks was spent in London, which had the highest share of all UK regions. The second most popular region for English language students was Northern England which accounted for 24% of all student weeks spent in the UK.
- In addition, 15,213 part-time students enrolled at English UK member centres.


#### **State Sector Member Centres**

- Thirty-nine state sector member centres reported in 2020 welcoming 13,804 full-time English language students, who cumulatively stayed for 155,405 weeks.
- As a result of Covid-19, these overall figures translated into considerable y-o-y decreases, namely 59.5% and 53.5% respectively. This figure does not reflect fluctuation in English UK membership.
- Course duration increased from 9.8 weeks to 11.3 weeks, with adult students studying for an average of 11.6 weeks (up from 10.9 in 2019) and juniors for 2.3 weeks (2 weeks in 2019).
- In 2020, the top five sending markets for the state sector were China (43.7% of total student weeks), Poland (7%), Saudi Arabia (6.6%), Spain (5%) and Japan (3.2%).
- In the state sector, almost half (49%) of students attended their classes online either fully online in the UK (6%) or outside the UK (43%). 37% of students studied via blended classes (face-to-face and then switched to online or vice versa).
- English UK's state sector members additionally taught 6,560 part-time English language students for a total of 96,485 student weeks.


#### **Private Sector Member Centres**

- The 294 private sector member centres accounted for 69,642 students, who delivered a total of 375,351 weeks.
- Overall, the number of student weeks decreased by 75%, while student numbers fell by 85%. This figure does not reflect fluctuation in English UK membership.
- In 2020, 57% of all students were taught their language courses face-to-face while 30% enrolled and studied via the blended method. Almost every fifth student moved online, either within (4%) or outside (10%) the UK.
- Junior students enrolled in 112 private sector centres, which catered to an average of 169 students. The average number of adults per member centre stood at 244.
- The under-18 age band comprised 27% of all students and 10% of weeks in the sector.
- The average length of stay of an adult student increased to 6.7 weeks. Juniors stayed for an average of 1.9 weeks.
- The top five sending markets in 2020 were Saudi Arabia (19.2% of total student weeks), France (7.1%), Italy (6.8%), China (5.6%) and Japan (5.4%).
- English UK private sector members also catered to 8,653 part-time students.













#### SOURCE REGIONS PERCENTAGE OF TOTAL STUDENT WEEKS











#### SOURCE REGIONS PERCENTAGE OF TOTAL STUDENT WEEKS




